The Association of Moving Image Archivists is pleased to announce a call for applications for its 2015 Scholarship Program. This year, three scholarships will be awarded: The Rick Chace Foundation Scholarship funded by The Rick Chace Foundation; the Sony Pictures Scholarship, funded by Sony Pictures Entertainment and the Universal Studios Preservation Scholarship funded by Universal Studios. All three scholarships are administered by AMIA, and are awarded as financial assistance to students of merit who intend to pursue careers in moving image archiving. Each scholarship consists of a \$4,000 award. The funds will be sent to the students' educational institutions and applied to tuition or registration fees for the 2015-2016 academic year.

Students accepted into or enrolled in a full-time, graduate-level or other advanced program in film or television studies or production, library or information studies, archival administration, museum studies, or a related discipline may apply. The application deadline for the Scholarship Program is May 15, 2015
